III.B.6. Course or Curriculum Development

University of Maryland

1. FMSC 641: Couple Therapy: Theory and Techniques

Course was redesigned in 2020

This course was redesigned to introduce content and practices that addressed the latest developments in couple therapy as well as the diversity of couple relationships. As a result, half of the course was modified to introduce content on polyamorous relationships, BDSM (Bondage, dominance, sadomasochism) relationships, LGBTQA+ relationships, intercultural relationships, conceptual organization and integration of couple therapy models, online couple therapy, use of Web-technology in couple therapy, the Internal Family Systems model, and financial stress and shame issues in couples. The syllabus was also modified to have more in depth presentations, discussion, and practice of Emotion Focused Couple Therapy. In addition, the syllabus was modified to introduce the diversity of couple configurations in the first quarter of the course instead of doing it at the end as it used to be taught in the past by previous instructors. This change reinforced the notion that white, middle-class, cisgender, heterosexual, monoculture couples' relationships are not the norm or model against which all other couples should be compared.

2. FMSC 745: Gender and Ethnicity in Family Therapy and Service Delivery Course syllabus redesigned in 2020

The topics and materials for this course were modified significantly (75%) to focus more on white supremacy and fragility, intersectionality, social justice and equity, racial identity development, language brokering and working with interpreters in therapy, immigrants and refugees, Asians, Latinx, and gender, sexual, and religious minorities. The syllabus incorporated videos and reading materials were changed (75%). In addition, in 2021 when I taught the course for the second time several more speakers were invited to class: Dr. Mia Smith-Bynum (Black families) Dr. Jessica Fish (LGBTQ+ research), Dr. Jodi Cobb (LGBTQ+), Dr. Kevin Roy (Toxic masculinity), Dr. Archana Drogra (South Asian families), Dr. Bethany Wang (East Asian families), and Rafee Al-Mansur (Muslin families).

Virginia Tech

1. HD 5744: Multicultural Issues in Marriage and Family Therapy Course developed at Virginia Tech in 2010

To enhance our MFT students' cultural competence and their ability to serve the increasing culturally diverse population in the metropolitan Washington DC area, I requested to develop and teach a course on multicultural issues in MFT. I first taught this course in 2010 and continued teaching it biannually at Virginia Tech. The main goal of the course is to improve students' cultural competence by helping them (a) explore their own cultural identity and membership in privileged and unprivileged groups (gender, race, ethnicity, social class, age, disability, sexual orientation, religion, etc.), (b) critically examine attitudes, beliefs, and biases about cultural groups different from theirs, (c) increase their sensitivity to cultural differences and issues of power, privilege, and discrimination, (d) improve their specific knowledge about various cultural groups, and (e) develop culturally sensitive skills for therapy including assessment and treatment strategies.

2. HD 5444: Clinical Marriage and Family Therapy II: Postmodern Approaches, Spirituality, Mindfulness and Acceptance, and Integrative Approaches in Marriage and Family Therapy

Course Redesign in 2009

HD 5444 was the third and last course that students had to take on marriage and family therapy models. I made modifications to this course based on students' feedback in the clinic practicum and identification of the MFT models not covered in previous courses, but relevant in the field. As a result, the redesign of this course syllabus focused more on the presentation and practice of postmodern approaches such as collaborative and narrative therapies and the incorporation of spirituality in therapy. In order to strengthen students' ability to conceptualize and intervene from any of the therapeutic models presented in this course, students were now required to write a paper applying two different models to the same case. In addition, students had to explore their own spirituality and how it shaped their therapy practices in a self-examination paper. Class discussions also focused on the epistemology underlying the various therapy models so students could organize the MFT models according to their own epistemology.
